The boardwalk is becoming a reality. The new boardwalk will stretch more than 600 feet along Ocean Front South, providing visitors with an unobstructed view of the ocean. "The boardwalk will have a positive impact on the overall economic development and success of Salisbury," State Representative James Kelcourse said. "It has been great working with DCR, the town manager Neil Harrington, the Board of Selectmen, many local businesses and State Sen. O'Connor Ives. This was truly a group effort and a perfect example of what happens when people are committed to working together in the best interests of the community." On schedule for completion around Memorial Day, it will have seating, shade areas, lighting, and handicap access. This boardwalk is the first of many plans that will enhance the beach-going experience. The SBBA continues to be a part of the beach's many successes.

Police Station.....



The first responsibility of municipal government is to provide for the safety of its residents. This facility provides our police department with many more resources to not only investigate and solve crimes, but also to strategize on how to further prevent crime in our community. We now have a few more dispatchers on board and will be merging the fire department dispatch into the police department. On the first floor is the town's **Emergency Operations** Center. Moving it to the police station frees up needed space in the Salisbury's Fire Station. When not in use as the operations center, it can be used for training and/or community meetings.
