

### Greetings from Our New President

Dear SBBA Members,

After 12 years of serving as the SBBA President, Ray Champagne decided it was time to "downsize" and pass the reigns to a successor. I was humbled and honored when Ray approached me with the possibility of becoming the next President of the SBBA. In the 33-year history of the organization, there have been only two Presidents besides Ray - both "founding fathers" of the organization - Ron Guilmette and Al Peterson. It is therefore with great enthusiasm and excitement that I embark upon this journey.

My wife Monique and I moved to Salisbury in 2007 from nearby Wenham when the last of our three children went to college and we became "empty nesters". We immediately fell in love with the beauty of the ocean, the beach and the salt marsh. In 2018, when I retired from my career in banking and finance, I ioined the SBBA Board as a Director. I was impressed with the organization, its leadership and its mission – "To improve and Protect the Quality of Life in our Community."

This summer has been a unique and challenging time for Salisbury Beach residents and merchants. The COVID-19 pandemic has altered our way of life and the way we conduct our daily interactions with one

another. However, we made it through the summer in relatively good shape and we will continue to persevere into the fall and winter months. We encourage everyone to continue to adhere to federal, state and local guidelines and wear masks and socially distance when necessary.

The SBBA mission conjures up many thoughts and images, but foremost, it focuses on protecting the great natural resources with which we have been blessed. The SBBA is committed to advocating for beach and marsh resiliency and the strategic planning, resourcefulness and hard work that goes with it.

During the past year, we have been meeting with town officials, our state legislators, and the Department of Conservation & Recreation. We received and published a detailed accounting of the revenues and expenses associated with the Preservation Trust Fund, established by legislative mandate in 2013. The intention of the Trust Fund is to insure the long-term preservation and maintenance of Salisbury Beach.

In our meetings with Town Manager Neil Harrington, Senator Diana DiZoglio, Representative Jim Kelcourse and DCR Commissioner Jim Montgomery, we have enlisted their support in our beach resiliency efforts. Due in part to these discussions, in the past year DCR has installed and repaired approximately 32,000 feet (over 6 miles!) of sand fence from the New Hampshire line south to the reservation. In addition. DCR installed 750 feet of Moby Mats at various beach access points and 640 feet of

boardwalk material between reservation parking lots 2 & 3, completing the walkway from the campground to the beach.

This is a good start, but we have a lot more work to do. With your help and support, we can accomplish great things!! Please share your thoughts on the state of our beach and your ideas and recommendations to make Salisbury Beach even better. We encourage your input and look forward to hearing from you.

The SBBA held our Annual Meeting on August 10th. It was conducted via Zoom
Teleconferencing this year due to the COVID-19 pandemic and was also simulcast on our local SCTV cable channel. Ray thanked the membership for their support during his 12 years as President and discussed some of his key accomplishments.

#### News from the MRBA (Merrimack River Beach Alliance) Group.

Senator Bruce Tarr of Newburyport established this group over 10 years ago. Its function is to bring attention to the rising tide issues that are faced in Newburyport, Newbury and Salisbury.

Senator Tarr along with Senator DiZoglio, Representatives Kelcourse and Mirra, Mayor Holiday, and representatives from Salisbury (including the SBBA), Newbury, plus DEP, Coastal Zone Management, Army Corp of Engineers and more than 20 other groups meet monthly. They discuss the issues related to climate change, beach erosion, application and permitting, financing of dredging the river and sand placement. It is a very long process.

Approximately 31,000 cubic yards of sand has been earmarked for Salisbury Beach to be placed on 1400 feet of shoreline from Murray Street to Fowler Street. It has been designed but needs to be sent for final approval and funding. Stay

There is another project that is being studied. This project is about dredging the Merrimack River for navigation. There is about 220,000 cubic yards of sand that needs to be removed. That sand will be placed at the Northern end of Plum Island. That area is in desperate need of beach rebuilding to protect the homes. It is estimated that it will offer protection for 3 to 5 years. It is still unclear when that project will begin.

The group continually tries to streamline the permitting process. Residents at a recent MRBA held at PITA Hall expressed frustration at the snail's pace in beginning meaningful solutions. We all know how important readiness is for our future. We are hopeful that a plan for resiliency can be developed for each community to deal with the Rising Tide.

#### **Fall Town Meeting**

The Salisbury Town Meeting will be held on Monday, October 26, 2020 at 7:00 PM at the Salisbury Memorial School. Updated COVID procedures including Social Distancing will be required. There are several Articles of interest to be voted on including a citizens petition for Resident Parking Permits. Warrant Articles will be posted on our website.

#### **Big Block Update**

A developer's plan to build a 235unit condominium/apartment complex at the corner of Broadway and Ocean Front South, which was turned down by the Conservation Commission, has been going through the appeal process with the state Department of Environmental Protection. A decision had been expected sometime in the fourth quarter of this year, but has been pushed back to first quarter 2021 due to the pandemic.
